Lanark Early Integration Program

A part of Lanark Renfrew Health and Community Services

LEIP provides services to childcare programs (childcare centres, nursery schools, home childcare agencies, licensed school aged programs, accredited recreation programs, EarlyOn child and family programs) to support the inclusion of children with special needs.

What Do We Do?

- Provide services so children with developmental, physical, social, emotional or communicative needs can be included in licensed child care and recreation programs.
- Help parents link with appropriate services, and assist with the coordination of these services.
- Assist with the transition into school
- Offer education and training opportunities to child care providers and community groups.
- Loan equipment, toys, and books from our library

Who Is It For?

- Families with a child between the ages of 0 and 12 (in the County of Lanark)
- Families concerned that their child may be exhibiting a developmental or physical disability
- Children who have developmental, physical, social, emotional or communicative needs
- Care providers, in either a preschool or licensed home setting, looking after a child with special needs
- Anyone wanting information on disabilities and/or inclusion

How Does It Help?
